


You will have the unique opportunity to immerse yourself in Chinese culture, taking advantage of an active social and cultural programme, while living and learning on the campus with full access to its high quality facilities. Your Chinese language skills will rapidly improve as you study Chinese as an integrated part of your course.

MODERN FACILITIES

Nankai's campus is located in Nankai District, Tianjin. A key multidisciplinary and research-oriented university, Nankai occupies over 200 hectares and is home to 21 academic colleges.

The university has also established collaborative relationships with more than 290 international universities and academic institutions.

As a student on an international programme, you will benefit from full access to all the university's facilities and support services.





UNIVERSITY LIBRARY SERVICES

As part of your orientation programme, you will be shown how to use the libraries and locate key resources. Nankai has four main libraries and a number of resource centres across its campuses. The university library collection totals 3,822,000 volumes and 30 terrabytes of e-books. There are a number of special collections and reference books to meet both academic and research needs and a book circulation service allows students to access the titles they need for a prebooked duration – minimising the number of textbooks students need to buy.

There are a range of online and digital resource centres specialising in different disciplines and quiet spaces set aside for private and group study.

MULTIPURPOSE 'SMART' CAMPUS CARD

On arrival, you will be issued with a multi purpose smart card. This will not only act as your student ID, but also doubles up as an access swipe card for libraries and teaching buildings, a top-up credit card for campus canteens and supermarkets, which can also be used for city transport (buses, subways and taxis).

COMPUTER FACILITIES

When you arrive at the university you will be given an internet account which allows you access to over 100 library computers and the campus wifi.

Each school has a dedicated IT suite, which is available to students from Monday to Friday. There are wireless hotspots across the campus, including wifi zones in a number of the university's cafés and bars – all offering free wifi for students.

SPORTS FACILITIES

Nankai University has an olympic-size swimming pool and a well-equipped outdoor stadium and running track, as well as a range of soccer and basketball courts. There are over 100 tennis, table tennis and badminton courts for students to access.

You will also find the university has sports clubs to most tastes -including of course, high quality Kung-Fu and Tai Chi clubs.





UMC PLAYS A SIGNIFICANT ROLE IN MODERN MEDICAL TEACHING AND TRAINING IN TIANJIN AND ALSO PROVIDES ACCREDITED TRAINING FOR A RANGE OF INTERNATIONAL ORGANISATIONS SUCH AS THE US HEART ASSOCIATION EMERGENCY CARDIOVASCULAR CARE AND THE WHO DISASTER MEDICAL RESCUE TEAMS.

The Nankai MBBS is a six-year, English-medium programme designed to meet the high global demand for qualified doctors. If you have A-level or equivalent qualifications and want to progress directly into medical training, our combined bachelor and medical degree programme may be the right choice for you.

Medical degrees awarded by Nankai University are internationally recognised and validated by the World Health Organisation (WHO). Validated English language Chinese MBBS degrees are recognised in South Africa, Saudi Arabia, India, Pakistan for local professional medical board examinations.

An MBBS degree from Nankai is a primary medical qualification (PMQ) allowing direct progression into professional medical practice.

EXPANDING ECONOMY

China's economy is growing very quickly with new job and investment opportunities being created every year. Tianjin's GDP is the fastest growing in China (around 16% per year) and there are new foreign companies setting up and investing here every month. The vast number of firms opening in China in recent years means that there is a great chance to find work here after graduation. The continued investment and expansion will also provide plenty of space for career development and promotion in the future.

LANGUAGE SKILLS

Studying abroad means you can often pick up the language very quickly. Within a couple of months you will have learnt the basics and if you work hard, within a year you should be able to hold a decent conversation in the mother tongue of one fifth of the world's population.

A foreigner who can communicate well in Chinese is still very rare and will make you stand out above of all other 'wai guo ren' (foreigners) trying to do business in China.

GUANXI (NETWORKING)

It is possible to find work in China from abroad, but job websites are not the usual way that Chinese people look for work. If you are considering working in China in the future, living in China will ensure building strong 'guanxi'.

While you are a student in China, you will have time to make many friends and get to know your professors (a professor's pay is relatively modest, so many have consultancy projects or businesses on the side). Building these friendships not only creates a personal relationship, but also a potential business relationship. If a position comes up that you may be right for, many Chinese people would rather give the position to a friend of a friend, whom they trust, rather than to put out a job advert.



MORNING

I get up, take a shower and go out to get something for breakfast. I usually grab some food at the Nankai University market, which is on the way to the School of Economics where we have our classes. My favourite breakfast food is one of the Tianjin specialities - baozi - steamed buns with various delicious fillings. When it's colder, I eat inside the market, but when it gets warmer I always eat in the park by our teaching building.

There are always some students studying and locals practising traditional Chinese arts - "people watching" in China is really fun!

After breakfast I head to the classroom and do some reading before I have my first class of the day.

Our classes last for an hour and a half, but we take a short break after 45 minutes.

AFTERNOON

After class I meet some friends to go for lunch. Lunch time is when I usually go to the student canteen, because not only is it cheap and the food good, but it's also very convenient. Plus I tend to bump into people I haven't seen for a while when I'm there. After I'm done eating, I go to my favourite café with really fast internet to do some work. The afternoon classes start. I normally have two classes with short breaks in the middle of each class. We also have a half an hour break in between the two courses.

Different from lunch, we almost always get more adventurous and go to one of the family-run restaurants in the south-western part of the University. I really like the very simple and authentic atmosphere of these restaurants and they serve delicious home-cooked meals from all over China!

I get back home and do some more studying. I work on the readings and assignments we have to do for my major and then I usually study Chinese for a few hours. I prefer working in the evenings, so going to bed at midnight is not unusual for me.

PRIOR TO YOUR ARRIVAL

PRE-DEPARTURE GUIDE

Once you have confirmed your place, you will receive a pre-departure guide containing practical information on preparing to travel to China, and will also include a visa application pack to assist you in applying for your visa, information on arriving in Tianjin and enrolling on your course. The guide also includes information to help you adapt to living and studying in China.

YOUR ARRIVAL

TRAVELLING TO TIANIIN

All students studying on degree programmes or those who are joining our academic English programmes, should plan to arrive in Tianjin. Tianjin's airport has regular flight connections with both Guangzhou and Shanghai, as well as other cities in Asia. You will find more details in your pre-departure guide.

WHEN SHOULD I ARRIVE?

You should arrive in Tianjin on the Saturday or Sunday prior to the start of your course. All courses commence with a group orientation programme, which will cover everything you need to know about Nankai University and Tianjin, and should help you settle in to your new surroundings.

INSURANCE

Included in your course fee is a comprehensive insurance package, which covers loss of personal possessions, travel, health and medical claims. INTO is an appointed representative of Endsleigh Insurance Ltd, which is authorised and regulated by the Financial Services Authority. CULTURAL ACTIVITY PROGRAMME



HOW DO I CONFIRM MY PLACE?

- You may wish to consider using a visa processing service in order to obtain your Chinese visa, however please note that this is considerably more expensive than applying directly to the Chinese Embassy.
